



## PROCESS FOR LISTING/DELISTING OF A RESTRICTED OR PROHIBITED SPECIES Transgenic and Invasive Species Part 413, P.A. 451 of 1994

Time Estimate	Action
<b>I. Review &amp; Recommendations</b>	
	A. The nomination packet for species addition/removal is received by the Natural Heritage Program, Wildlife Division, Department of Natural Resources (DNR).
Estimated time 4 weeks (28 days)	<p>B. The Natural Heritage Unit will determine if the packet is administratively complete. The standard is identified in the Prohibited/Restricted Species Listing/Delisting Request Information Guide.</p> <p>C. The Natural Heritage Unit will work with the Invasive Species Advisory Council (ISAC) <b>Departmental staffs</b> to develop a representative list of stakeholders who may be affected by the changes.</p> <p>D. The Natural Heritage Unit will provide notification on the Department’s website of each pending species review.</p> <p>E. The Natural Heritage Unit will notify the DNR Director and Directors of the Michigan Departments of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and Agriculture (MDA) of the pending species review.</p> <p>F. The Natural Heritage Unit will coordinate with ISAC to establish a Technical Review Committee identifying members as needed to complete a risk assessment and draft recommendation on the proposed species (listing/delisting/reclassification).</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Members of the Technical Review committees</li> <li>• For each listing the ISAC will provide a charge document to the Technical Review Committee identifying the assessment and recommendations needed.</li> </ul>
Estimated time 6 months (180 days)	G. The Technical review Committee will complete the risk assessment and submit the findings along with <b>its</b> recommendation(s) to ISAC.
Estimated time 1-2 months (30-60 days)	<p>H. ISAC <b>Departmental staffs</b> will evaluate the Technical Review Committee documents and develop a “Proposed Species Recommendation.”</p> <p>I. ISAC will conduct a public meeting to receive input on the recommendation. The public input may be taken in conjunction with a scheduled ISAC meeting.</p> <p>J. After receipt and assimilation of the public input, ISAC will hold a meeting to determine a “Final Species Recommendation.”</p>
<b>II. ISAC, Department of Natural Resources Commission, Michigan Department of Agriculture Commission</b>	
1 months (30 days)	<p>A. The Department ISAC designees will provide the DNR Director with copies of the nomination, information received from the public, and the Final Species Recommendation</p> <p>B. The Directors of the DNR and Department of Agriculture will provide the ISAC recommendations to the NRC and Agriculture Commission as an information item.</p>
1 week (7 days)	C. The Natural Heritage Unit will notify the nominator of the ISAC decision and advise of any necessary legislative action on the proposed prohibited/restricted species list change.
<b>III. Legislative Action</b>	
Estimated time 6 months (180 days)	<p>A. If any changes to the statutory lists are recommended by ISAC, Department staff will work with the Legislature to amend Part 413.</p> <p>B. The Department will notify the nominator of any legislative actions taken.</p>
